We've had an excellent half term and can't wait for the new learning opportunities in Year 4! We hope you all had a restful holiday and are ready to explore our new topics.

We will be learning about maps by developing our map reading skills in Geography. We will be using compasses and maps to navigate to Alexandra Palace. In Science, we will be learning all about sounds, including pitch and volume, and the way sounds travel in solids, liquids and gases.

Information about what your child will learn this half term is on the other side of this sheet.
