Dear Parents and Carers,

We've had an excellent half term and can't wait for the new learning opportunities in Year 4! We hope you all had a restful holiday and are ready to explore our new topics.

We will be learning about maps by developing our map reading skills in geography. We will be using compasses and maps to navigate our way to Alexandra Palace. In science, we will be learning all about sounds, including pitch and volume, and the way sounds travel in solids, liquids and gases.

Information about what your child will learn this half term is on the other side of this sheet.

If you have any questions about your child's learning, do not hesitate to speak to us before or after the school day.

We look forward to working with you and your child. Mr Croall, Miss Corrales, Miss Farhana, Miss Ivanova and Miss Dani As writers, we will be taking inspiration from world book week to write stories based on The Jungle Book. We will then study King Leah by William Shakespeare, writing letters from King Leah to his three daughters. Finally, we will be writing poems influenced by the visit of Paul Delaney. What are the main features of an informal letter?

As mathematicians, we will be focusing on multiplying and dividing using a formal written layout, writing decimals and solving money problems involving fractions and decimals to two decimal places, as well as estimating, comparing and calculating money in pounds and pence. We will also be reviewing our 4 operations. How many different ways can you show 3 x 432?

As scientists, we will be learning about how sounds are made, recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium, for example air or water, to the ear and find patterns between the pitch and volume.

Can you sort instruments according to how the sounds are made (plucking, blowing, striking)? What sounds do they make?
