Welcome one and all to 2018/19 academic year. We hope you all had a restful holiday and are ready to dive into the new half term.

We will be starting the year with a two week project called 'We Are Londoners.' We will be exploring London's past and present by focusing on different communities and the impact they have had on our city.

Should you have any concerns or wish to talk about your child's progress, please feel free to speak to us. We are available to talk after school every day.

Information about what your child will learn this half term is on the other side of this sheet.

We look forward to working with you and your child. Mr Croall, Miss Corrales, Miss Farhana and Miss Dani As writers, we will be creating persuasive leaflets as a part of the We Are Londoners project to encourage people to visit our fantastic city. We will then focus on Oliver Twist by writing our own stories set during the Victorian era. We will use empathy to understand how he would have felt throughout the story. What are your favourite places to visit in London?

As Mathematicians, our focus will be on developing our core number skills up to 10 000. We will be counting in multiples of 25,100 and 1000 in order to count larger numbers comprehensively. We will also learn about place value to 4 digits, using language such as 'greater', 'smaller', 'less', and 'more', using the mathematical symbols <,> and =. In addition, we will be adding and subtracting up to 4-digit numbers using concrete resources and the column method. How would you use a number line to solve 15 + 8?

Maths

Place value, addition and subtraction

As Scientists, we are going to work scientifically and use the scientific method to conduct experiments. We will create questions, hypothesise, experiment, observe and record our conclusions. We are also going to compare and group materials according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases. We will explore through observation that some materials change state when temperatures change; and we will also look at the water cycle. What are some examples of solids, liquids and gases?
