Dear Parents and Carers,

We've had an excellent start to the school year and are ready for another action packed half term. We especially enjoyed studying the Victorians and investigating different states of matter.

This half term, we will be learning about Victorious Vikings and the impact of their settlement in Britain. We will be studying their actions and behaviour which will enable us to understand their legacy on modern Britain. In science, we will be learning all about the digestive systems of different animals, including studying the diets of a variety of animals.

Information about what your child will learn this half term is on the other side of this sheet.

We look forward to working with you and your child. Mr Croall, Miss Corrales, Miss Farhana, Miss Ivanova and Miss Dani As writers, we will be studying the famous story of Beowulf and writing a diary from the perspective of a Viking. We will also discuss examples of a variety of dilemmas, writing our own stories with a dilemma. Finally, we will focus on the Viking, Biorn to write our own character description. What makes an effective character description?

As mathematicians, we will be focusing on fractions and decimals. We will be adding and subtracting fractions; working out unit fractions of shapes; lengths and sets of numbers; and recognising and writing decimal equivalents. Furthermore, we will be learning about how to tell time and how to calculate elapsed time. What is $\frac{1}{8}$ of a bar of chocolate made of 40 pieces?

As scientists, we will be learning about animals, including humans. We will describe the simple functions of the basic parts of the digestive system in humans, identify the different types of teeth in humans and their simple functions, construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey. Can you name the different types of teeth in humans?

PSHCE & RE

In PSHCE, we will be discussing our aspirations and how we will achieve them. What do you want to be when you are older?

In art this half term, we will be drawing portraits of Vikings focusing on facial features and proportion. We will then use water colour to enhance our portraits of Victorious Vikings. What type of facial expressions do you think a Viking would have?
