Year Five Spring Term 1 Curriculum Newsletter

We are Puerto Rico and Venezuela.

Welcome back for Spring 1. We have had a fantastic term so far. We have learned so much about climate change, interpreting bar and line graphs and writing third person narratives.

This term, Miss Johns, a trainee teacher, will be joining Venezuela class and be teaching a few lessons a week.

In Spring 1, Year 5 will be attending swimming lessons every Tuesday. It is essential that your child is fully equipped with a swimming kit: swim suit, swim hat and towel.

In English we will be writing stories with imaginary settings based around the Greek Myth, 'Pandora's Box'. We will be focusing on our paragraphing, using fronted adverbials and relative clauses. We will then turn our stories into play scripts and perform them to the other class. Later in the term, we will explore the features of Information Texts to write about the Solar System. The focus will be on sub-headings headings, and factual using information.

In Maths, we will be learning how to compare and order proper and improper fractions. Later in the term, we will explore how to turn fractions into decimals and percentages showing the same value but different appearance.

What is 34 as a percentage? How can you prove it?

For our Earth and Space topic, we will be learning about how our solar system works, day and night, changing shadows and the earth's rotation.

Can you list all of the planets in our solar system in order?
