Dear Parent/ Carer,

Following my previous letter dated 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2018, I am writing to inform you about some essential drainage works at Alexandra Primary School that Haringey Council are planning to undertake. These works are part of the Council's wider commitment to make sure our borough is safe and clean for everyone who lives and works here. In partnership with Thames Water, the Council works hard to identify properties that may be polluting the watercourses and rivers in Haringey. The aim of this project is to reduce pollution throughout the borough and in turn, improve the quality of our streets, parks and green spaces.

The works we need to undertake include the diversion of the existing drainage in the footpath and the road in order to connect into the correct sewer. These works are essential because Alexandra Primary School through no fault of their own was identified as one of the properties that was misconnected into the Moselle.

Due to the location of the works required and the scale of them, we know there is going to be some disruption to school users. In recognition of this, Haringey Council has liaised with Alexandra Primary School to make sure that everything is safe for people in and around the school. To minimise the impact to everyone, we have produced the following works timetable, which will take advantage of the half term break:

- The works will commence on the 11/2/19 and are due to end by the 28/2/19

During this period, there will be a partial road closure in place so access for vehicles during drop off and pick up times will be severely restricted so please allow extra time for your journey. Please also note that during the above period, there will be an increased level of parking enforcement to try to limit any congestion.

We believe this project will deliver considerable improvements to the environment and we apologise for any inconvenience this project may cause.
