#### **ATTENDANCE**

There are **147** children with 100% attendance since the beginning of the year. These children will be first to receive a **bronze attendance certificate** (100% attendance in one term) if they maintain this until the end of term.

All of our data and evidence as well as national data shows that children who are punctual with good attendance will have better educational outcomes leading to better job opportunities in later life.

If your child is sick please call school to leave a message or speak to our attendance officers, Sharni Webster and Natalie Weekes. If we do not receive a first day absence call we will not authorise the child's absence. Multiple unauthorised absence will result in a referral to our Educational Welfare Officer and potentially to a fine.

Our school target for the year is **96%**; we currently have attendance figures of **96.0%**. We must give a special mention to **Reception Panama** who have attendance of **98.6%** in the past two weeks.

Also well done to **Mexico 4** who have an attendance of **98.5%** since the beginning of term and **18 children** with **100% attendance**.

#### PE

At Alexandra we believe that health, fitness and wellbeing are of paramount importance. Many activities taught in PE require children to work in groups to solve problems or as a team. These opportunities are excellent for developing both leadership and cooperation skills. Children are encouraged to be creative, cooperative and competitive and to face up to different challenges. Verbal communication is important and gives children the opportunity to express their opinions and develop self-esteem.

All classes from year 1 to year 6 have two PE lessons a week, one outdoor and one indoor. Indoor lessons alternate between gymnastics and dance. Outdoor lessons cover a range of sports including netball, hockey, football, basketball, cricket athletics and tennis.

We also have very popular after school sports clubs including next term, multi - sports, gymnastics, archery, fencing, ballet, girls football, basketball and boys football.

Our after-school clubs help develop children's skills and provide them with extra opportunities to utilise these skills in a competitive environment. Our girls and boys football clubs take place at Heartlands High School which is an excellent opportunity for the children to experience playing football on a larger, marked pitch. These clubs cost £4 per session.

We are hoping to develop opportunities for the children to participate in sports in a competitive environment throughout the spring and summer term.
