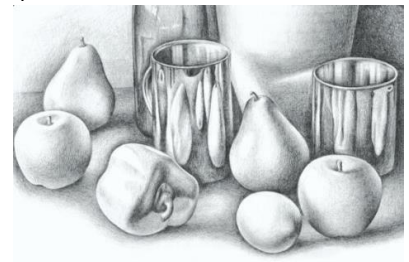
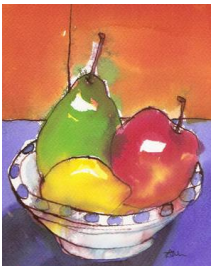


Art week commencing Monday 27th April

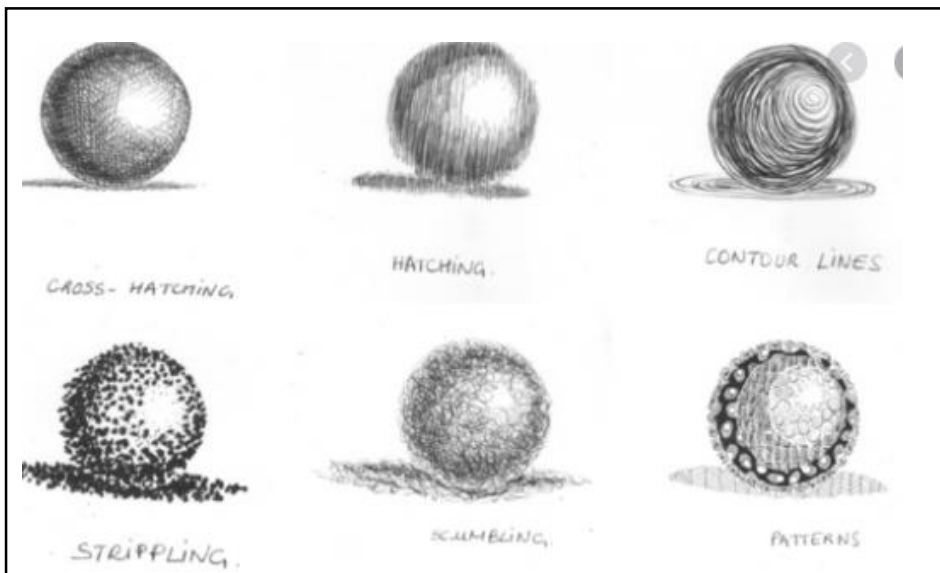

Here are some 'still life' that have been painted by other people:

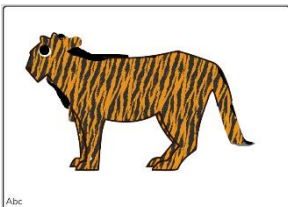
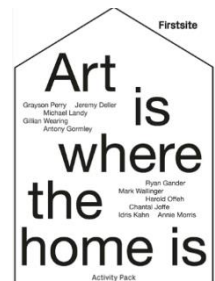
