Facts about St Ives

- **St Ives is** a seaside town and port in west Cornwall, England, United Kingdom. The town lies north of Penzance and west of **Camborne** on the coast of the Atlantic Ocean.
- **It was** once a fishing village but fishing has died out and the town is now a holiday resort.
- **St Ives has** become known for the large number of artists who work there.
- It was named best seaside town of 2007 by the Guardian newspaper.

- St Ives is home to one of the Tate galleries .
- St. Ives is known as the ‘jewel’ in Cornwall’s crown. It is a popular resort for visitors, especially families. St. Ives has many attractions and things to do for all different kinds of tourists. In the past, St. Ives was a busy fishing village.



- Although much of the fishing has reduced, the harbour is still in use for boat trips, tourist fishing and seal spotting tours to other locations on the coast. The town has four beaches. The golden sands and great conditions for watersports are enjoyed by everyone.
- There are many places to stay in St. Ives, ranging from large hotels to small guest houses and holiday cottages. St. Ives offers a wide range of places to eat, including cafes, restaurants, fine dining and the traditional fish and chips and ice cream. Don’t forget to watch out for the seagulls!
