What is Geography?



'Geography is the study of Earth's landscapes, peoples, places and environments. It is, quite simply, about the world in which we live.'

Physical geography is the study of the Earth's natural features, such as mountains, rivers, deserts and oceans and we look at the weather and the climate.

Human geography looks at the impact and behaviour of people and how they relate to the **physical** world and we look at villages, towns and cities.

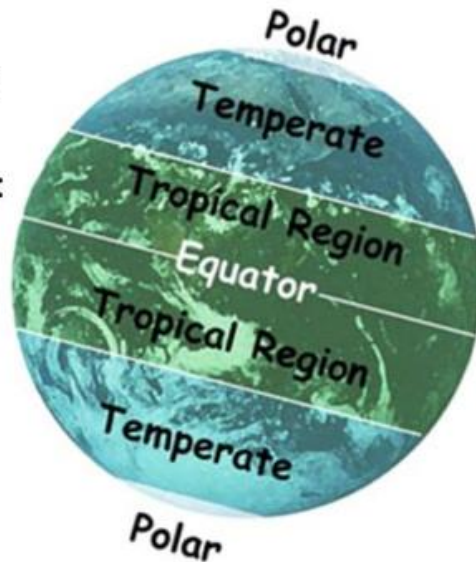
Success Criteria 4: I can identify the different climate zones on a globe.
