

Home Learning Summer 2 Week 6 – Science

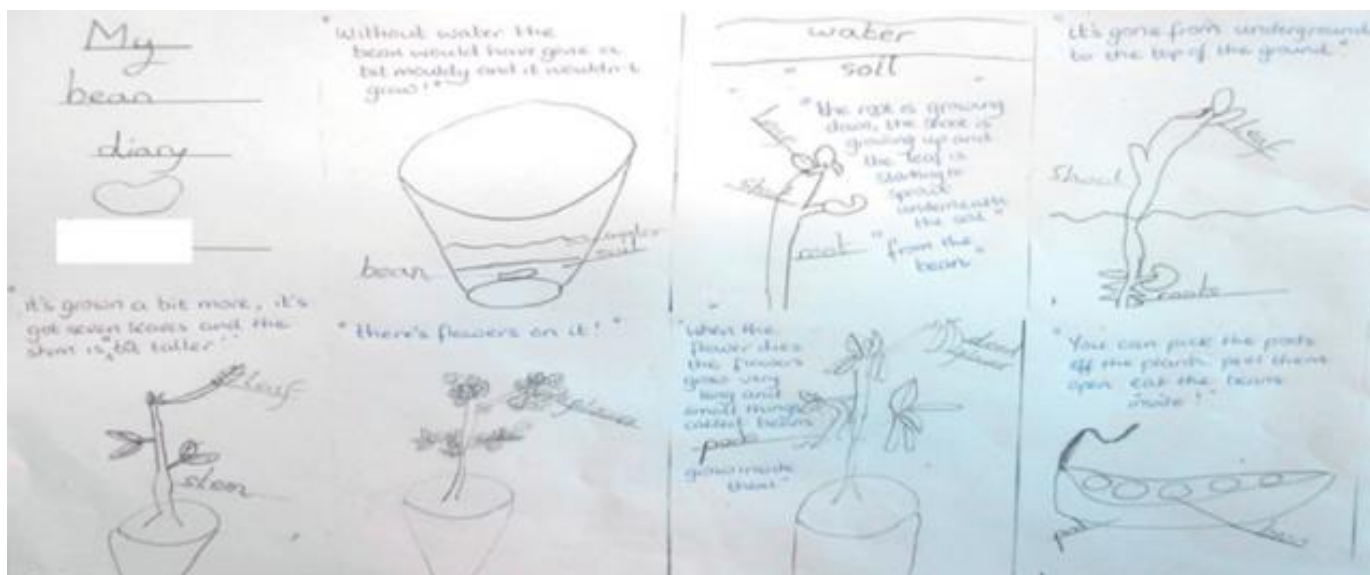
In science this half term we will continue to look at plants.

Activity 1 – update your bean diary

Keep a bean diary in your science home learning book to keep track of the changes over time. Write the date and draw a picture of what your bean plant looks like. Then write 1-2 sentences describing what the plant looks like or what has changed since your last diary entry.

Challenge: Measure your plant with a ruler How tall is it now?

What is the difference between trees with leaves like these...

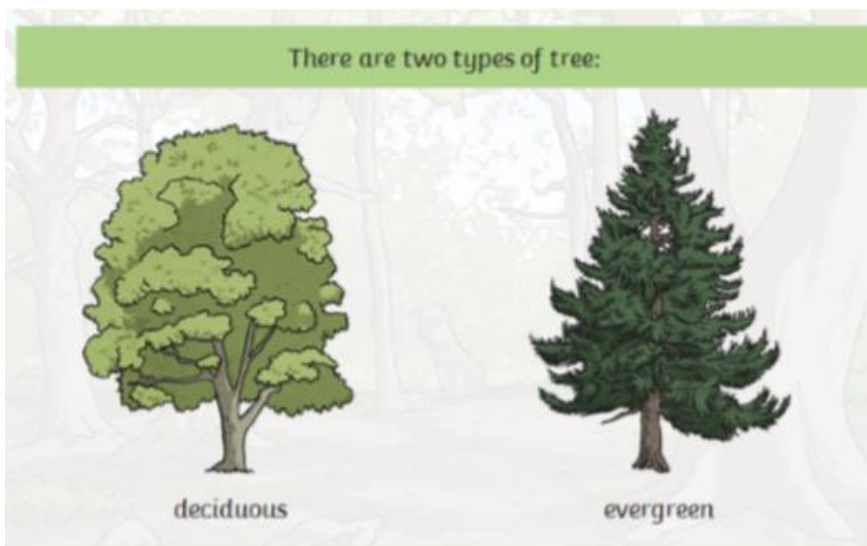


...and trees with leaves like these?



Clue...

Clue: You will only be able to see one of these sets of leaves all year round.



These trees are **evergreen**. They never lose their leaves.



These trees are **deciduous**. They lose their leaves in Autumn and grow new ones in Spring.
