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MORNING PUNCTUALITY

We have been delighted how smoothly we are able to get the children into school in the morning, over the past term. This in a large part, is due to the families who ensure that the children arrive at school on time in the morning.


We **open the gates** in the morning at **8:45**, within two to three minutes all children are through the gates and in class ready to begin their learning for the day.

As a result of this we have reviewed our procedures for the morning. From **Tuesday 8th June**, the **gates will be locked** at **8:50**.

Any children arriving after 8:50 will need to go to the late gate for access to school and will be marked late for the morning session.

Thankyou to all of our families who daily ensure punctuality for their children in the morning.

COVID UPDATE

We are still managing the risk to health and safety linked to Covid 19 and are in constant contact with Haringey Public Health and the Department for Education regarding how to mitigate possible risks.

We appreciate the contribution that families are making when collecting children by wearing masks and by maintaining social distancing around the school site.

A COVID-19 lateral flow test is a test for people without COVID-19 symptoms. If you are following NHS guidelines and testing as part of the twice weekly scheme, then the school only needs to know your result if a member of your family tests POSITIVE.
