BRONZE ATTENDANCE CERTIFICATES

We know how vitally important it is for all children to have good attendance at school.

It is clear, and all evidence shows it, children with good attendance at school year on year achieve better educational outcomes. They will have better Key Stage 2 outcomes, are more likely to achieve higher grades at GCSE and access to better further and higher education opportunities. This then results in better future job prospects with increased earning capacity in adult life.

Our whole school target is 96%; many children currently have much better attendance than that.

Each term we celebrate those with 100% attendance with bronze, silver and gold certificates. A child with 100% attendance for one term will receive a bronze certificate, for two terms silver and for the whole year gold. We have a number of children who have received gold certificates for the past three years.

We currently have 170 children with 100% attendance since September who are in line to receive a bronze certificate in December. Notably we have 27 children in EYFS with 100% attendance, 28 in year 3 and most impressively 31 children in year 5.

E-SCOOTERS

Currently in the UK, you can legally buy an e-scooter but you cannot ride it on a public road, cycle lane or pavement. The only place that it can be used is on private land.

There has been a significant increase in road traffic accidents involving e-scooters which have included several fatalities; members of the public have also been injured due to e-scooters being driven on footways.


This is one of the reasons, that 'One Kind Word' has been chosen as the theme of Anti-Bullying Week taking place from 15th to 19th of November 2021.
