SCIENCE DAY

Dr Andrew Szydlo, an internationally acclaimed chemist and scientist, wowed Alexandra children this week with his mindblowing and hair-raising experiments. He demonstrated a variety of chemical reactions which included the chemistry of colour to pyrotechnics and high explosives.

"I liked the science experiments because it had loud bangs. When the scientist made fire by mixing medicines to other chemicals, I was completely mind-blown!" – Ayman, Mexico Class

"When he mixed acids together, it created chemical reactions – some were smoky, some changed colour, some exploded into flames and some made loud bangs. It made me like science even more." – Chanae, Nicaragua Class

This celebration of science was part of the wider celebration of science for **Science Week** which is the week beginning **14th March**. During the week, children will study the work of female scientists under the heading of **We Are Engineers**.





The week of study will include investigating how energy causes motion or creates change. Pupils will be given a STEAM challenge which involves finding a solution to a variety of hands-on and practical activities by creating, designing and innovating models.

LEARNING IN YEAR 1

This term, children in year 1 are exploring famous landmarks around Britain. The children were busy creating their own landmark models over the half term break in preparation for the project. The children have also researched significant landmarks around the world and have created a fact file.

As part of the World Book Day celebrations, they used scientific methods to create a rainbow effect using wizard skittles and lemonade. The children really enjoyed experimenting, predicting and being scientists.
