# Writing

We be exploring Ancient Greek myths and recounting these stories. We will then move on to looking at informal letters and how to craft these. We will focus on ensuring we use standard English in our writing, explore the sentence structures we use (fronted adverbials) and practice using commas in the correct places in our sentences.

#### Mathematics

We will explore place value (moving up to 4 digit numbers), fractions and developing our mental strategies for addition and subtraction and practising our written methods for addition and subtraction. We will also be practising our times tables: 2X, 4X, 8X, 10X, 3X, 6X and counting in 25s and 100s. Year 4 need to know all the times tables by the end of the year so help from home would be much appreciated.

# History

We will be exploring the achievements of the Ancient Greeks and their influence on the Western World. This will include looking at their studies of medicine, their study of animals and their inventions. We will also be looking at the Olympics and their influence on sport.

### Science

We will be developing our science skills while exploring and investigating sound. We will be exploring how sounds are made, how sound travels and investigating how we change the pitch and volume of a sound.
