Also, please practise the **times tables** with your child. Our focus this half term is: 2X, 4X, 8X, 5X, 10X, 3X, 6X and counting in 25s and 100s. Please encourage your child to use the Timestable Rockstars app to support their timetables learning.

It is essential that your child **reads every day.** Reading is a fantastic way for your children to expand their vocabulary, increase their knowledge and improve their writing. They should complete in their Home Reading Journal at least 5 times a week and should bring it to school every day.

It is important that your child does their homework – please help them by making sure they have time to do it.

PE

This year, Year 6 will be going swimming each week. Swimming for both Espana and El Salvador is on Tuesday. It is vital every child has their swimming kit in school on Tuesdays (including a swimming hat).

In addition to swimming, each class will complete an outdoor PE lesson in school. For Espana, this will be on a Friday and El Salvador a Thursday. Your child's P.E kit must contain a white t-shirt and either blue or black shorts or tracksuit bottoms. Plimsolls or plain trainers must be worn during all P.E lessons. Writing
