YEAR 6 PHOTOGRAPHY PROJECT

The children in year 6 recently learnt photography techniques, such as the rule of thirds and the significance of colour. They learnt that the rule of thirds is a type of composition in which an image is divided evenly into thirds, both horizontally and vertically; the subject of the image is placed at the intersection of those dividing lines, or along one of the lines itself.

The children explored and photographed the local community including Wood Green and Alexandra Palace Park, capturing images that reflected their interests.
